Construction Update


Thank you for your patience during the utility relocation work that took place over winter break. Demolition of Huesman and Sullivan Halls will take place in June. The new residence halls that will be constructed will sit almost entirely on the same footprint as the existing buildings, but will be three- to four-stories tall. Doheny Hall, which is located in between the residence halls, will remain. LMU has retained Steinberg Hart, one of the nation's top architectural firms, to design these premier residential facilities. Steinberg Hart also designed buildings at Stanford, UCLA, USC, and Cal State Fullerton. These new facilities will total over 600 beds, which will allow LMU to provide on campus housing to an additional 400 students.





Looking Ahead

- Hannon Field will go offline in April to be used as a construction laydown yard as contractors begin to move on to campus to mobilize in preparation for construction activities.
- Beginning May 13, a 12-foot construction barrier will be erected around Sullivan and Huesman Residence Halls, designed to reduce noise audible beyond the construction site. The barrier will be in place prior to the start of demolition activities on Sullivan and Huesman Halls.
- Planned construction hours will be from 7 a.m. until 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday.
- High noise and vibration producing activities are being scheduled between the hours of 8am and 5pm in an effort to minimize disruption to campus activities and our neighbors.



Timeline

April 2019

- Hannon field will be fenced to provide a construction lay-down yard and will be offline for the duration of the project (until Fall 2020.)
- Construction materials will arrive on campus and be staged inside the Hannon field area.

May 2019

- Construction barrier will be installed encircling Huesman and Sullivan Halls.
- Work inside the barrier will include decommissioning and salvage of materials in preparation for demolition.

June 2019

• Demolition of Huesman and Sullivan Halls begin.
